In the wake of the April 4, 2011 Dear Colleague Letter and an unprecedented groundswell of student activism across the country, the U.S. Department of Education has been actively investigating colleges and universities for their handling of sexual assault complaints. Educational institutions are scrambling to retool their investigative efforts and hearing processes in order to meet burgeoning pressure from the federal government and the court of public opinion. Attorneys representing those cast into the student conduct hearing process have witnessed the dangerous effects this phenomenon has had on the rights of both male and female students.

This Symposium will feature attorneys with experience in handling student conduct hearings at various stages, and those who handle subsequent litigation against educational institutions. This is an opportunity to share strategies and experiences with colleagues who have guided students through the process and have represented them in student conduct hearings and state and federal court.
